THE NEW LITURGICAL YEAR

The liturgical year is a system of yearly church celebrations by which the faithful repeatedly relive the salutary mysteries of their salvation. In the liturgical year Our Lord Jesus Christ continues to live with us, to teach us, and to lead us to our heavenly destination.

The liturgical year, like a beautifully painted iconostasis again and again places before our eyes Christ's sublime work of redemption in order to keep us intimately united to our Divine Redeemer. It inspires us and gradually forms a living Christ in us " until we become a perfect man" (Eph. 4:13). It is indeed "a year of grace," a year of God's favor.

The Church follows the computation of time according to the civil calendar year. However, in the Byzantine Rite, the liturgical year begins on September 1st, while the Western Churches begin their liturgical year on the first Sunday of Advent.

The Byzantine Church inaugurated the first of September as the beginning of the liturgical year in honor of the victory of Emperor Constantine the Great (d. 337 A.D.), over his adversary, Emperor Maxentius, in 312 A.D. Prior to Constantine, Christianity was constantly exposed to persecution. But with Constantine's victory, as attested to by St. Ambrose (d. 397 A.D.), the Church began a new life.

The liturgical year in the Byzantine Church ends with the feast of the Beheading of St. John the Baptist (August 29), with whom the Old Testament also concludes. The New Testament, liturgically symbolized by the New Year, begins with the preaching of Our lord, as indicated by the Evangelist: "After John's arrest Jesus appeared in Galilee, proclaiming the good news:-The time has come and the kingdom of God is at hand" (Mk. 1:14-15).

The liturgical year is indeed a year of grace and our sanctification, keeping us in close union with Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The liturgical year helps us to become more and more Christ-like, it molds Christ within us. In a word, through the liturgical year Jesus Christ continues to live among us, He continues to teach us, He continues to lead us toward our eternal salvation.

The Greatest Commandment

"Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" Matthew 22:36

This question was posed by one of the scholars of the law in an attempt to test Jesus. It's clear, from the context of this passage, that the relationship between Jesus and the religious leaders of His time was beginning to become contentious. They were beginning to test Him and were even trying to trap Him. However, Jesus continued to silence them with His words of wisdom.

In response to the question above, Jesus silences this scholar of the law by giving the perfect answer. He says, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-39).

With this statement, Jesus gives a complete summary of the moral law found in the Ten Commandments. The first three Commandments reveal that we must love God above all and with all our might. The last six Commandments reveal that we must love our neighbor. The moral law of God is as simple as fulfilling these two more general commandments.

But is it all that simple? Well, the answer is both "Yes" and "No." It's simple in the sense that God's will is not typically complex and difficult to comprehend. Love is spelled out clearly in the Gospels and we are called to embrace a radical life of true love and charity.

However, it can be considered difficult in that we are not only called to love, we are called to love with all our being. We must give of ourselves completely and without reserve. This is radical and requires that we hold nothing back.

Reflect, today, upon the simple call to love God and your neighbor with all that you are.

Reflect, especially, upon that word "all." As you do, you will most certainly become aware of ways in which you fail to give everything. As you see your failure, recommit in hope to the glorious path of making a total gift of yourself to God and others.

Lord, I choose to love You with my whole heart,

mind, soul and strength. I also choose to love all people as You love them. Give me the grace to live these two commandments of love and to see them as the path to holiness of life. I do love You, dear Lord. Help me to love You more. Jesus, I trust in You.

Ми люди несемо відповідальність один за одного — за ближнього і тільки в цій відповідальності ми можемо вповні освідомити значення любові. Якщо ми любитимемо Бога і світ, то цей світ ми перетворимо у Царство Боже!




The total funds raised in the 2018 Annual Eparchial Appeal was \$151,703. The amount rebated to seven parishes that exceeded their goal totaled \$26,869. Announcing the New Sacred Items Catalogue on our Eparchial Website!



Story: As churches close or declutter, they are faced with the question: "What do we do with sacred items?" In the past we had no records of what went where, as people randomly decided what to do.

Problem: People want to know what will happen to their sacred items. They want the items to tell their story, have a record of where they came from and where they will go. We had no system for storage, selection, awareness or distribution.

<u>Solution:</u> Under the direction of AGEMI (Angel Gabriel Eparchial Ministries Inc.), Nestor Halaitso, Executive Secretary, has acquired a program creating a system for cataloguing these sacred items. It works like an online library. The items collected are catalogued, complete with photo, measurements, written description, and history if available. These are now accessible on our website under an icon link called "Sacred Items Catalogue". Anyone can go there to browse. Any parish, with consent of their priest, can "go shopping". There are no costs involved to get any of the sacred items that are catalogued in the system: such as a chalice, vestments, icons, gospel stand, etc. Currently 201 items are available for viewing. Categories include: candle holders, furniture, liturgical vessels and instruments, icons, books, bells, tabernacles, crosses, miscellaneous and more.

Storage: We are still developing the system of storage, but here is what we have in place now. In an indoor facility, we have a space for items that need to have a controlled environment. This means books, vestments and select items are stored where they are protected from the 3 M's: mildew, mice and moths. We also have a waterproof Sea Container which is used for other items like altars, candle holders, furniture, tabernacles ... which can withstand the change of temperatures associated with being stored in an unheated outdoor container.



The season begins on September 1, the World Day of Prayer for Creation, and runs through October 4, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology in many Western traditions. September 1 was proclaimed as a day of prayer for creation (World Day of Prayer for Creation, or Creation Day) by Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios I for the Orthodox in 1989, and was embraced by the other major Christian churches in 2001and by Pope Francis for the Roman Catholic Church in 2015.


