

### Urgent letter to Clergy of the Eparchy of Saskatoon

The Catholic Bishops of Saskatchewan have initiated a public campaign to encourage our Provincial Government to enact legislation to protect the conscience rights of health care professionals. The public Call for Conscience campaign will include education and action components. On Sunday, February 24th, we would like all parishes to screen a video and invite parishioners to send letters to the Ministers of Health, the Premier, and the Leader of the Opposition. Parishioners can sign the letter electronically at <a href="https://www.canadiansforconscience.ca/saskatchewan">https://www.canadiansforconscience.ca/saskatchewan</a> or parishes can provide printed copies to be signed at Sunday Divine Liturgies on February 24.

This campaign is prepared in cooperation with the Coalition for HealthCare and Conscience, a national coalition of churches, healthcare facilities, and medical professionals. There is also an ecumenical team working to coordinate the Call for Conscience campaign in other churches across Saskatchewan. The Call for Conscience campaign addresses the lack of legal protection for healthcare professionals who cannot participate in Assisted Suicide or Euthanasia as a matter of conscience. In Canada, assisted suicide was legalized by the Supreme Court and federal Parliament, but medical professions are a matter of provincial jurisdiction. As such, specific legal protections still need to be established to protect healthcare professionals.

Opinion polls indicate that even among those who support assisted suicide there is a 60% approval for conscience protection. However, some provincial regulatory bodies are moving to restrict conscience rights and require participation by doctors, nurses, pharmacists, and others who work with vulnerable patients. We are calling upon our provincial government to enact clear protections for these healthcare professionals in matters of conscience.

The Knights of Columbus are providing leadership to promote this campaign across Saskatchewan. We are also looking to the Ukrainian Catholic Women's League is also mobilizing its local councils. If you have a KofC or UCWL council in your parish, please work with them to ensure active participation from your parish and if your church has a Service and Social Justice Committee there could be opportunity for them to get involved. You will also find that medical professionals in your parish will

be willing to work on this campaign. Ask a doctor, nurse, or medical student to speak to the parish about how the introduction of assisted suicide and euthanasia is changing their healing profession.

- 1. Your immediate attention must be given to the appointment of a Parish Coordinator of the Campaign and you must communicate that person's name and contact information to the Eparchial Coordinator, Deborah Larmour. You may contact Deborah Larmour at <a href="mailto:uwitness2family@skeparchy.org">uwitness2family@skeparchy.org</a> if you have any questions about this step or any of the further requirements. - 2. If you are unable to access the Google Drive mentioned above to print out the instructions and letters and access the video please contact Deborah to arrange for them to be put on a memory stick for you to pick up at the Clergy meetings next week. It is on Google Drive so it should be accessible to most of you.
- 3. Bulletin announcements of the Campaign will be sent out concurrently with this letter to be placed in bulletins for Sunday February 10 and Sunday February 17 explaining the campaign and requesting support from the Parishioners. They are also found on the Google Drive link <a href="http://bit.ly/CFCSask">http://bit.ly/CFCSask</a>
- 4. The Parish Coordinator is to establish teams to facilitate signing the letters on Sunday, February 24, 2019. (These teams should be established by February 20.)
- 5. Showing of the video and an announcement from the pulpit or via the Coordinator or a health care professional in your Parish on **Sunday the 17**<sup>th</sup> **of February**. (Suggested script is on the Google Drive link <a href="http://bit.ly/CFCSask">http://bit.ly/CFCSask</a> above.)
- 6. Once the letters are signed please forward all of them to Deborah Larmour, at 214 Ave M South, Saskatoon Sk, S7M 2K4 to be received at the latest by March 6, 2019. These will them be forwarded to the Campaign for Conscience Headquarters on or before March 20. Please note that each person is to sign, print their name and address as well as email on letter. (Copies will be made of these letters to give to both ministers of Health, the Premier and Leader of the Opposition.). The presentation of the letters will be done formally at the Legislature.

Your active support and cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated as we must not remain silent on this issue which is a direct threat to our fundamental freedoms of conscience in this country.

#### LUKE 18: 10-14

The parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector ranks with the Good Shepherd parable as the one where we feel confident that we have got the message. Its message, at least its primary message, is delivered unambiguously in the closing sentence, "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled and. whoever humbles himself will be exalted." It is pure, clear Jesusspeak and we all accept it. What is not so transparent is the other message or messages which, as in so many parables, may be lurking inside the story and which may have determined the choice of characters who set the scene.

Pride comes in many forms, there is even a good sort of pride, but all of us know people who boast inordinately of their achievements, sporting, academic or both; of their breeding, their wealth, their charity, their lovely garden or their successful grandchildren. That's standard – a part of life.

What Jesus is doing in this story is contrasting unfavourably the more detestable man whose boast is his observance of religious law against the man who was not just humble, in the sense of being un-boastful, he was an actual, though sorrowful, sinner; a man who habitually defied the rule book of his religion and may not even have had the realistic option of changing his way of life. It is a scenario with which most of us will be familiar within our own families or circle of friends in that minefield of uneasy consciences, the out-fall of marital breakdown and the establishment of new relationships and responsibilities from which it would be hard, if not impossible, or even wrong, to get disentangled.

Am I, you may be wondering, about to say that the rule book is of little significance so long as you have a loving, contrite and humble heart? Decidedly not. If we did not believe that the Church has a function in promoting good order, godliness, justice and peace in this world, none of us would have reason read privately or to hear publicly, God's Word read and preached upon. But even the most conservative Christians will acknowledge that Jesus, in his time, was radical and unfettered in his judgement of established authority, frequently supporting it in principle but fiercely critical of its ruthless application. "Woe to you who lay burdens on others which you will not lift yourselves." What he cannot abide, as we see in this story, is to have the poor, the unfortunate and the inadequate classified dismissively as sinners through circumstances which may, in large part, not be their fault.

Then as now our terminology is bad. We use that catch-all word "sin" to cover both cruel and callous evil and also the technical infringements of regulations about which the Pharisee was so self-righteous. He may have fasted twice a week and paid his tithes, but where was his compassion towards those less fortunate than himself? Where was his compassion for the tax-collector?

The practical outcome of all this is not easy to resolve. The Pharisee was, of course, right to obey the letter of the law and had the good fortune to live in circumstances in which he could easily do so. Likewise, we all know of people who have been particularly attracted to the Catholic Church by the clarity of its rules and regulations and the firmness of its moral prohibitions. But a priest has only to spend time talking to his parishioners to be reminded that life is not so simple for everyone, not even for the most devout.

In Jesus's time, to be a public servant or tax gatherer for the Romans was tantamount to collaborating with the occupying powers. What is more, they made their money by extortion or receiving bribes and were classified by the law-abiding as irredeemable sinners along with the prostitutes. Yet Jesus

says this man went home justified, at rights with God and that the Pharisee did not. As in so many instances, such as his famous dictum that the Sabbath is made for man, not man for the Sabbath, our Gospel message is reminding us that we are all weak; that the Church is to be the Church for Sinners and that we must not allow faceless legislators to curtail our freedom to do what is right and helpful for those who are in trouble. In God's Church, law and compassion are to go hand in hand and the experience of the ages has been that we need a framework of ideals and guidelines and even clear rules to help us do this.

## Поминальні Суботи - Сорокоусти

Сорокоустами називаємо моління за померлих в часі Великого посту. Слово "сорокоуст" дослівно означає: сорок уст, себто моління 40 устами чи священиками.

Сьогодні згідно традиції на час посту записуємо імена близьких нам людей, які померли і даємо на сорокоусти.

Служби за померлих нагадують думки молитов з чування при плащаниці перед Великоднем. Парастас, зокрема священичий, дещо подібний до Єрусалимської Утрені у Велику суботу. Наша Церква старається в такий спосіб ототожнювати наш перехід від смерти в життя із переходом ("пасхою") Христа. Наш чин похорону включає різні форми духовної потіхи, наприклад, Псалом 90, різні вірші Псалма 118, уривки з листів св. Павла. Він рівночасно має за ціль збудити свідомість "у тих, що не мають надії" про справжню мету людського життя.

В часі посту ми якраз роздумуємо над сенсом життя, приносимо свої жертви й за тих, хто уже відійшов до вічності. Це "свята і благочестива думка": приносити "жертву пре благання за мертвих, щоб вони звільнилися від гріха", як

читаємо у Старому Завіті (2 Мак. 12, 45-46).

Св. Амвросій Медіолянський сказав про померлого друга: "Я його люблю і тому супроводжую його сльозами та молитвами в землю живих (див. Пс. 114, 9). І не покину його аж поки не запроваджу його туди, куди його заслуги взивають його — до святої гори Божої (див. Пс. 2, 6), де  $\varepsilon$  вічне життя".

Наша Церква, як любляча Матір, піклується за своїх дітей, — не тільки про живих, але й про спочилих. Бо у Бога всі живі. Тому ми маємо від Бога великий дар — право молитися до Нього і надію бути почутими, підкріплену Його обітницею. Адже Господь сказав: «Все, чого з вірою попросите у Отця Мого в ім'я Моє, буде вам». А апостол Яків навчає нас: «Моліться один за одного».

Ми молимося за живих — наших рідних, близький, знайомих, тощо. Але і вони самі можуть молитися за себе. А от померлі вже не можуть за себе молитися, тому якщо важливою є молитва за живих, то тим більш важливою і угодною Богові є молитва за померлих, яка може полегшити і навіть змінити участь тих, хто упокоївся з вірою у вічне життя і з надією на Боже милосердя. Якщо ж людина лише сумує й плаче за померлими, але не молиться за них, то це не приносить спочилим ніякої користі, а для живих є причиною печалі та глибоких сердечних ран.

3 кожним днем наближається той час, коли і ми, подібно спраглим у пустелі,

будемо чекати, щоб хтось подав за нас милостиню або палко помолився в храмі Божому чи вдома. Тож, пам'ятаючи про цей час, творімо молитву за померлих — щоб Господь послав людей, які і за наше упокоєння колись Йому молитимуться.

## All Souls Saturdays - Sorokousty

A beautiful part of our Catholic tradition is praying for those who have departed from this earthly life; prayer for the dead is one of the greatest acts of charity we can perform. We pray for the repose of their souls, the forgiveness of their sins and that they may rejoice in eternal life in heaven. We pray for the souls of the departed in the daily prayers and services of the Church, as well as in our own personal prayers and by offering Liturgies for them.

Week after week, we remember our departed relatives. The Church dedicates each Saturday of the year to the souls who have gone into eternity, but have not yet entered into eternal rest in heaven. In addition, there are certain Saturdays of the Liturgical Year which are specifically dedicated to remembering and praying for the dead.

These Saturdays are called All Souls Saturdays. They include Meat fare Saturday, the second, third, and fourth Saturdays of the Great Fast, and the Saturday before Pentecost Sunday. What a joy that the Church gives us days of special prayer on which we can give our full attention to our departed kinsmen that have departed from the ages!

Why these specific Saturdays? The theme of Meat fare Sunday is the Last Judgment. It is fitting that we pray the day before for all Christians who have fallen asleep, especially those for whom no one prays, so that they may stand worthily before God at the Final Judgment.

The Saturdays of the Great Fast are appropriate for remembering the dead since this is a time for increased prayer, especially for the repose of those who have departed. Because the descent of the Holy Spirit is the final act in our redemption, we want those who have fallen asleep to also share in the graces of this act.

Therefore, we honour their memory on the Saturday before Pentecost.

How important it is to pray for these people, for people who are our brothers and sisters in Christ, who have lived out their lives – some of them long lives, others altogether short, but who have all gone to stand before the Face of the Lord; that is, who have all traveled the path along which every one of us must sooner or later travel! They know what awaits us, which means that their prayers are beneficial for us.

So let us pray for one another: we, for the departed; and the departed, for us – and in this way we will all be saved. Let us pray that our life might be at least a little closer to God; let us ask the Lord to save the souls of our departed loved ones, friends, relatives, and enemies – everyone who needs our prayers. And let us hope that their prayers will, in just the same way, help us to better ourselves and to become more spiritualized and deified.

May the Lord help us all, both the living and the departed – everyone who stands in need of God's mercy, which means all of humankind and, above all, all Christians, for the Apostle Paul said that the Savior came into the world to save all men, especially those who believe (cf. 1 Timothy 4:10). Let us be faithful, that the Savior might be our Redeemer from the torments of hell and the Source of joy in

Himself – Jesus Christ our Lord, to Whom is due all glory with the Father and the Holy Spirit now and forever. Amen.

One of the holiest works, one of the best exercises of piety that we can practice in this world is to offer sacrifices, alms, and prayers for the dead.


