As we approach the International Day of Peace on September 21st, we are reminded of the late Pope Francis' urgent call: "Peace is a duty, peace is a gift, peace is everyone's responsibility."

Today, and with the Catholic Church, we cannot forget the people of Ukraine, where war continues to devastate families, displace communities, and take innocent lives.

CNEWA, together with our partners on the ground, is providing emergency aid which includes important food, shelter, medical care, and pastoral support to those suffering in Ukraine. Yet the needs remain great.

- Distribution of food, hygiene products, clothing, and medicine to vulnerable residents.







### RECTORY AND CATHEDRAL OFFICE ROOF PROJECT


The rectory and cathedral office buildings consists of multiple roofs in order to cover a large footprint. The roof area that is directly above the west entrance to the cathedral office is much lower than the roofs to the north and south of the cathedral entrance roof. This lower roof area is subject to significant snow drift buildup which contributes to consequential damages to the building. This accumulation of snow above the lower roof area is subject to numerous cycles of freeze and thaw that creates ice dams at the



lower west edge of the lower roof. This ice damming has progressively caused damage to the building cladding and perhaps even some amount of damage to parts of the underlying roof.

In an effort to reduce the extent of damage to the building over the lower roof area, workers are required following heavy snow falls to access this roof area and hand shovel the snow off of the roof. This is both dangerous and timely work.

Total estimated cost of the above remedial work, including all applicable taxes is \$21,600. Please consider providing a donation specific to the cost of the Rectory-Cathedral Office Roof Project. Project envelopes coming soon.
