

MY WEEK IN REVIEW

Christ Is Born!

Pastoral: House blessing x 4, altar servers, catechism, catechist training, funeral, baptism, UCWLC installation, Plast carolling, Jennifer from the warm-up shelter came to liturgy and spoke on how to become a volunteer and how to get trained. She gave an invitation to us suggesting that God has a reason for our two churches being in the territory of ground zero, on the front lines of the homeless situation. Do you think God has a reason for us being in this neighborhood? I also talked with Fr. Kevin about his parish's response to the homeless.

Administrative: Meetings: UCFoundation Sask, review of the liturgical books with the help of Zoriana and Yuliia who both have competence with Old Slavonic and Old Rus languages, Bishop x 2, safeguarding, personnel board, and finally I did two references for people applying to the GSCS for jobs.

Personal: Supper with Debbie and her Saskatoon family. I made candles, I mounted icons, I played in the snow and slept one night in the quinzee. It was a big week for my telephone. 89 phone calls, 60 people with whom I had conversations on texting apps. I am not saying this to brag or complain, but to share with you that I do business and pastoral phone ministry. Don't ever think "Fr. Ivan is too busy to bother him". I will always try to engage with you. I am your priest, right? Right.

Це був дуже насичений тиждень для моєго телефону. 89 телефонних дзвінків, 60 людей, з якими я розмовляв у додатках для текстових повідомлень. Я кажу це не для того, щоб хвалитися чи скаржитися, а щоб поділитися з вами тим, що я роблю роботу і пасторське служіння з допомогою телефону. Ніколи не думайте: «Отець Іван надто зайнятий, щоб його турбувати». Я завжди намагатимуся спілкуватися з вами. Я ж ваш священик, чи не так? Правильно.

Saint John Bosco: "It is not enough to love young people — they must know that they are loved"

Saint John Bosco was born in Turin, Italy. When he looked at children and youth, he did not see problems, but promises. He believed that every young heart has a spark of goodness that only needs to be nurtured with love, patience, and faith. Through his complete trust in them, he won their hearts, gathered boys from the streets, and helped them grow into honest citizens and faithful Christians.

Don Bosco taught the value of honest work, love for one another, and special devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. He encouraged frequent Confession and regular reception of the Holy Eucharist. He did not educate through fear — he educated through trust. His preventive system was simple yet profound: to be with young people, listen to them, rejoice with them, and lead them to God through friendship, example, and daily presence.

From this love for youth, the Salesian Congregation was founded in 1859. Its name comes from Saint Francis de Sales, the saint of gentleness and love, whom John Bosco admired as a model of pastoral care. The boys called him *Don*, meaning "father," because that is exactly what he was to them.

Today, the Salesians are present in over 130 countries, on all five continents, running around 1,700–1,900 mission centers. In Canada, they are active in all provinces except Saskatchewan. They have also taken deep root in the Ukrainian Greek-Catholic Church worldwide. In Ukraine, their ministry has been especially fruitful, helping youth ministry flourish in all regions. In 2023, Saint John Bosco was officially included in the UGCC calendar and is celebrated on January 31.

The charism of St. John Bosco is closely connected to Blessed Josaphata Hor-dashevskaya. It is believed that Father Kyrylo Seletskyi brought St. John Bosco's educational approach from Italy to Ukraine. Together with Blessed Josaphata, he founded the Congregation of the Servant Sisters of the Immaculate Virgin Mary, which continues the same charism: love for children and youth, especially the poor, gentleness, education through closeness, daily work, and catechetical instruction.

A memorable story illustrates his approach: Bartolomeo Garelli, a 16-year-old orphan considered "difficult," was about to be thrown out of the sacristy. Don Bosco noticed something good in him — his ability to whistle and organize others. Seeing potential instead of a problem, he gave Bartolomeo the task of whistling to gather the boys, helping him take responsibility and feel dignity. Bartolomeo became the first student of the oratory and an example for others.

This story shows Don Bosco's principle: the heart of a young person is reached only through love and trust. Today, he reminds us that true education begins with love that is felt and faith in every person, whom God never stops loving.




Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools Kindergarten Registration Open
